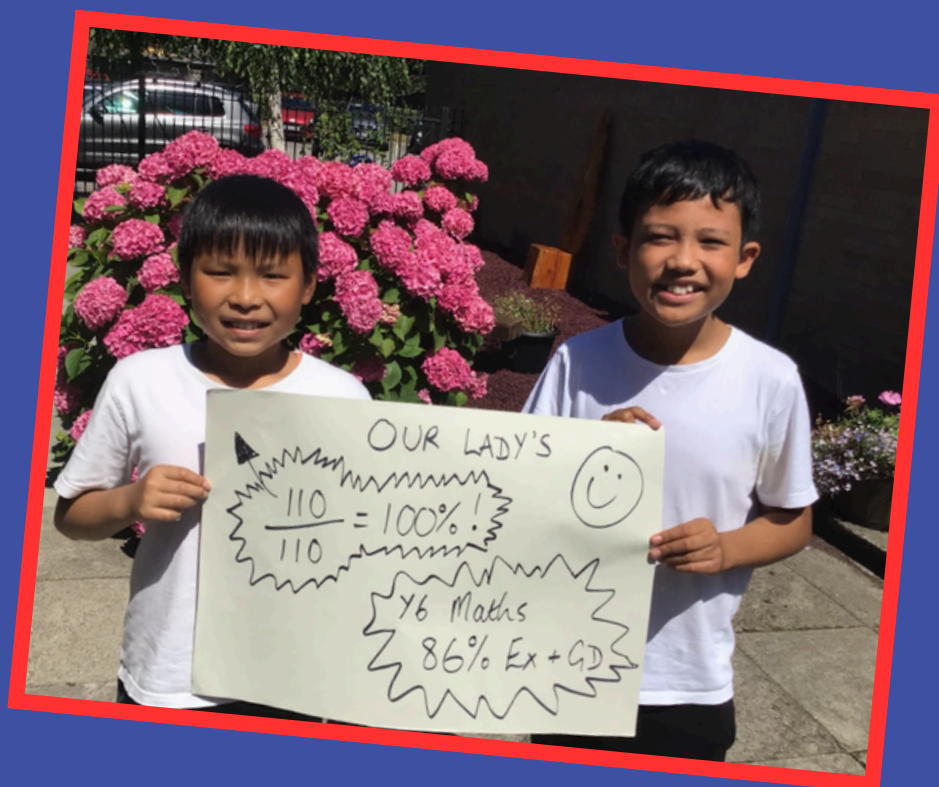

This week the children were inspired to know that with Jesus they too can do incredible things in His name, and whilst they may find reward on Earth, their real reward waits for them in Heaven.

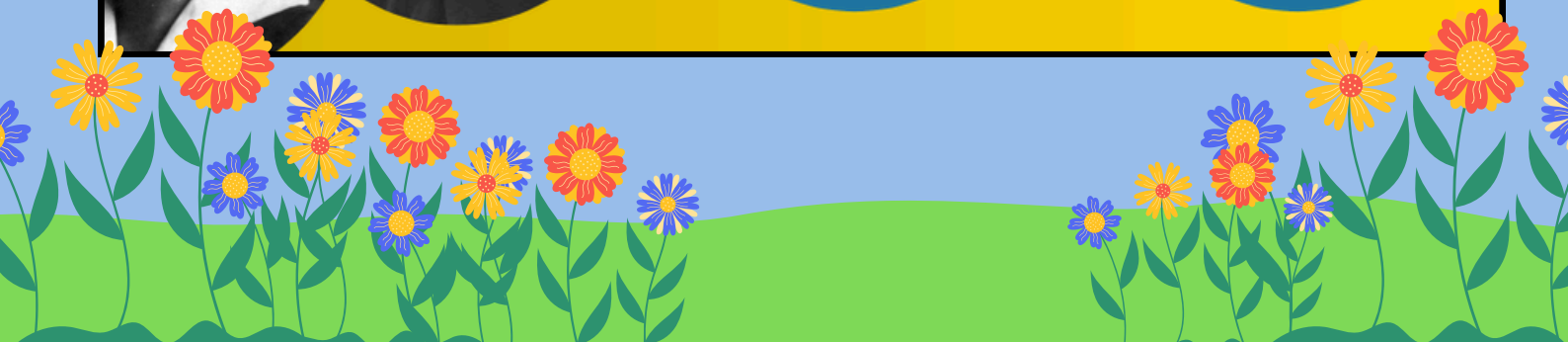

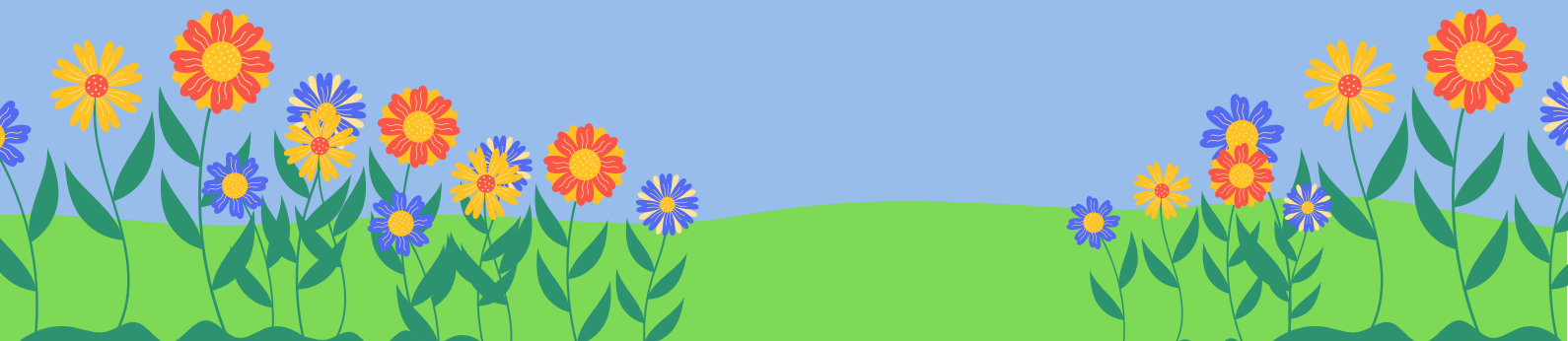
Catholic Social Teaching Assembly - Care For Creation

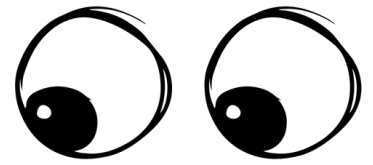
Well done to those who impressed their teachers because of their achievements, effort or behaviour, including Dolly in Y3 for her letter writing!
